Insurance – Pewsey Carnival will provide public liability 5 million insurance for walking classes 1 & 2.

Walking Class (ENTRY IS FREE!)

Class 1	Class 2
Individuals or Groups of Walkers with/without a Hand-propelled float/cart powered by batteries	Individuals or Groups of Walkers with/without Hand-propelled float/cart using a diesel generator.

The walking classes will be judged at the assembly field - **please note Petrol Generators are not permitted**

Motorised Classes (ENTRY IS FREE!)

Class 3 (smaller floats)	Class 4 (larger floats)
Units less than 9m pulled by a roadworthy motor vehicle, this includes quad bikes. <i>4 float marshals</i>	Units more than 9m pulled by a roadworthy motor vehicle. <i>6 float marshals</i>

Any motorised vehicle used in the procession MUST have notified their insurance company regarding the use of their vehicle in the procession. It is COMPULSORY to carry out a float risk assessment prior to the event.

***ONLY DIESEL GENERATORS TO BE USED ***

The Ron Oram cup will be awarded to the best entry. Prizes for 1st-3rd in each class

Safety Regulations for entering Pewsey Carnival Procession

ALCOHOL – not to be consumed during the procession.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS – any entrant with a known medical condition, heart complaint, etc is responsible for making themselves known to the Organisers and to the Senior First Aider; the latter is to be informed of any prescribed treatments/medications required.

FLOAT MARSHALS - Class 3 requires 4 float marshals - Class 4 requires 6 float marshals. Float marshalls must wear their tabard at all times and must not take part in any other role e.g. coin collecting.

WATER/FLUIDS/PROJECTILES - Do not fire any liquids or projectiles directly at a participant or spectator.

Float/Entry Construction/General Safety

RISK ASSESSMENT - It is compulsory that all float entries perform their own risk assessment

COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS – the use of combustible materials in Floats and Costumes is to be kept to a minimum; use the safest alternative material wherever reasonably practicable.

NAKED FLAMES / FIREWORKS /FLARES – no form of naked flame, fireworks or flares will be used

SOUNDS – Do not use equipment that can replicate gun fire or emergency vehicle imitation sirens

ENVIRONMENT - No polystyrene bubbles will be used (livestock use the field)

HEIGHT - Entries to be less than 4.5m including balloons, banners etc, (this is due to electric cabling overhanging the procession route)

FLOAT SAFETY - The float (trailer and vehicle) meets Health and Safety standards and is road worthy (compulsory to carry out a risk assessment prior to entering). The vehicle pulling the floats insurance company has been notified of its use in the procession.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER - Classes 3 &4 to carry a suitable fire extinguisher

ELECTRICS - All wiring to be checked as safe by a qualified electrician.

CHILDREN - Children under 13 will be seated or safely enclosed throughout the procession

SPEED - The speed of the procession is to be kept to 2mph unless advised by a Carnival Safety Steward to close in gaps.

GENERATORS - Classes 2, 3 & 4 will only use Diesel generators. **NO PETROL GENERATORS ALLOWED**

FLOAT ACCESS - No unnecessary climbing on or off the float during the procession.

Once the procession has dispersed, please make sure float marshals remain alongside the float until it's safe to stand down
